









It is my greatest pleasure to welcome you to the 9th KNUST Summer School. This Summer School is one of the most precious gems in the University's academic calendar. This year's School is under the theme "SDGs and Universities: Actions Towards KNUST's Mandate at 70 and Beyond" scheduled for Tuesday 31st August to Friday 3rd September 2021 is unique in many ways. This summer school is happening at a time when KNUST is 70 years as a University. Additionally, for the first time we are piloting a hybrid summer school which is a mix of both in-person and online sessions. This year's school is being organized in collaboration with our colleagues from Germany and CLEAN Africa and has been decentralized to the Colleges for greater impact. The focus is to bring individuals from multidisciplinary backgrounds together to deliberate on how to work together to achieve the SDGs.

The KNUST Summer School began in 2011 with the intention of offering staff the opportunity to increase their skills and knowledge in selected areas for productivity and excellence. The theme for the Summer School is 'SDGs and Universities: Actions towards KNUST's Mandate at 70 and Beyond'.

As a background; In September 2015, the UN General Assembly adopted the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development that includes 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), which include the following:

GOAL 1. No Poverty GOAL 2. Zero Hunger GOAL 3. Good Health and Well-being for all GOAL 4. Quality Education

Building on the principle of "leaving no one behind," the new Agenda emphasizes a holistic approach to achieving sustainable development for all. As a university, we should be seen leading the country to achieve these SDGs. However, there seems to be a knowledge gap with respect to these SDGs and their implementation. Knowledge of these SDGs would inform our activities as a university since we strive to achieve quality education and become the leading research university in the Sub-Region.

This year's Summer School also commences the KNUST 70th Anniversary Celebrations. We are excited to have foreign nationals from more than eleven countries joining us for the Summer School.

For the first time, the Summer School would be held both in-person and virtually. Senior Members may join online to the class and still make contributions. Registered participants who attend all sessions will be awarded a certificate of participation.

It is hoped that the Summer School will equip the staff of KNUST and those of her affiliate Institutions with new knowledge about the Sustainable Development Goals and the skills to implement them in their work.
